An Interview With Leah (aged 12)

Q1. What are your earliest memories of reading books – do you have a particular book you remember from that time?

My earliest memory of reading by myself is of a purple book which had a picture of a fox on the front. I read it when I was four and thought it was really exciting. I think there was a rabbit that died in it too. The first book I remember being read by my parents is Toddle Waddle by Julia Donaldson and Nick Sharratt, which I then read to my little sister when she was born. I liked the bit where I got to shout 'Stop!'.

Q2. What are your favourite kinds of books now?

I read every day. I like reading before bed but I also read whenever I get a few minutes. I read at the same time as my sister. If I have time, I'll read in the morning too.

I'm really lucky and already have lots of books. I have two big bookshelves and think I have about 300 books. My prized possessions are the Zom-B series by Darren Shan and a signed book from the poet AF Harrold. I also have a signed copy of Varjak Paw by SF Said.
